We are still working on the final 2018 schedule with the Faulkner but we definitely have **April**, **June**, and **December**. We will have more information to share in the next newsletter.

A reminder that the Hutton Show will change on **Saturday**, **January 13**, **from 10-12** and our limit now is only 40 pieces so bring your art and come early to make the cut. Also, remember that we no longer hold over pieces so all that is now hanging must be picked up. The show at 1919 State will change on **Saturday**, **February 10 from 10-12**. This is a juried show and we had a tremendous response at the last ingathering so the word is out on this venue's record of sales.

Coming up very early this year, on March 7

– March 11, is the Art show at

the S. B. International Orchid Show so start thinking exotic blooms! All entries must feature an orchid theme and again, sales are always healthy. All details are on page 1 of the newsletter or go to www.sborchidshow.com to register online.
