President's Message by Nancy Hull



While there was a great turnout for the Holiday Show ingathering – and 6 pieces were sold from that show – the participation in picking up artwork at the December 30 takedown wasn't exactly stellar. (My apologies for again beating this dead horse; I realize this is an issue for a very small minority of you, but perhaps you can

help your friends to whom this applies.) It isn't acceptable for SBAA to leave uncollected art cluttering the floor of any venue, nor is it appropriate for someone to burden the volunteer(s) managing the takedown with making multiple trips out to his/ her car with your art, ferrying said art pieces home for storage so that you can retrieve them at some more convenient time. SBAA's policy is that, should your work not be retrieved, no matter from what venue, by you or your designee, at the appointed time, your art will not be accepted into the next juried show at the Faulkner; you know if this applies to you (i.e. you had to pick up your art at someone's home), so please adjust your expectations for the next Faulkner show. If, in spite of the pickup date and time being posted in the newsletter, on the reminder card you were given at the ingathering, and in email blasts, it's difficult for you to remember to retrieve your art, please ask a friend to remind you. And, if you have an SBAA friend who you know needs an extra reminder, please give this person a call before the pickup day.

Although the SBAA isn't scheduled for a show at the Faulkner until June, there are several opportunities before that to get your work out. There will be an **ingathering at 1919 State** on **February 9**, and that show will be juried by Canadian artist Gaye Adams. This has been a good venue for sales, and it gets a lot of foot traffic, so it's worth the effort to bring your pieces in on that Saturday. (Even better, there is no gallery commission!) The next large (and exciting!) event that SBAA will be facilitating is the art show is in **March at the Santa Barbara International Orchid Show.** This is an open, themed show all art must feature orchids - and you are encouraged to submit your entries on line (go to the SBIOS website on the calendar page). Thanks in advance to Ray Hunter, who has agreed to jury this show.

At the January board meeting, there were several new issues under discussion, one of which was the Member Skills inventory, in particular under what circumstances are new skill categories added to the list. It's apparent that many skills and genres (e.g. stained glass, manuscript illumination, and mosaic art) are not listed separately. As these other skills are practiced by a very small minority of SBAA members, the board decided that, at this point, any skill or genre not having its own column can be explained adequately in the "other" column, and that the artist is free to use those terms on the show entry form for "medium" and "substrate."

Another item of recurring discussion is whether or not to continue having the quarterly show at the Hutton building on Chapala St. Over the last year or more, the participation has been waning, perhaps due to lack of sales or perhaps due to the limited space. Whatever the reason, the board feels that it's no

longer worth the volunteers' time to manage such a small show, so the ingathering that was held on January 12 will be our last one at that venue.

Lastly, if you know of someone who would like to be **considered for** membership in the SBAA, please let them know that **March 25** will be the next opportunity for applying.

As the months go by, we're slowly getting all the board members introduced to you, and this month, I would like to introduce to you long-time member and energetic volunteer **Jim Felland.**



I was born in Chicago and grew up in Indianapolis. My artistic beginning was at age 8. Entering a third grade poster contest my appetite for art work was initiated by winning 1st place with my entry. Through my public school years I would doodle, draw, paint and otherwise create as I found it satisfying to express myself at how I viewed the world. When in high school, I participated in all available art classes and their various media.

Attending Ball State in Muncie, I was given further experiences and challenges in the art world and my vision grew. Under the tutelage of a gifted art director, Dr. A. Nichols, I worked in oil, sketched with ink, formed sculptures, and created mobiles. The scope of my vision was enhanced after joining the Army as a staff photographer for 2 years in Germany. As a civilian again, I became a newspaper and freelance photographer that added width and depth to my view of life and this world.

Upon retirement, I realized a new approach with art that gave life to watercolor. With numerous Adult Education classes and various talented instructors, I added pen and ink to my medium. A 4 week stay in Norway added to my love of nature, color, and form. My most recent addition to my works came from a 3 week visit in Santa Fe, New Mexico. I am a member of Santa Barbara Art Association and Goleta Valley Art Association.
