President's Message by Nancy Hull



There was excellent participation in the May ingathering for 1919 State Street. Of the 62 entries, juror Thomas van Stein selected 46 for the show. First place was awarded to Jana Julian for *Old Times*; Nancy Hull 's *Zakynthos*

Sanctuary received second place, and third was awarded to Terre Martin Sanitate's Trees. Susan Price, Bill Hull, and Jerilynne Nibbe received honorable mentions for their work. The juror had high praise for the overall quality of the work submitted, and I hope you get the chance to go by and have a look. Thanks are due to new member Jerry Gottsdanker and to V.P. Bill Hull for hanging the show, to Frances Reighley for helping with curating as well as taking care of the data entry and labels, to Jim Felland for placing the labels, and to Louise Komp for handling the entry fees. Even a fairly small venue requires a team!

Speaking of teamwork, if you enjoy seeking out and trying new wines, there's a place for you on our reception team. As the team's beverage wrangler(s), you would buy the wine and other beverages for the reception, deliver them to the Faulkner, and store them between receptions. There will likely be only two or three receptions this year, and the duties could be shared, perhaps one volunteer doing the buying and storing and another the delivering. This is a great, and not very time-consuming, opportunity for you to do your bit for SBAA; and you'd be doing Larry Mancini, who's been filling this role for years, a big favor in allowing him to retire. I encourage you to contact Cathie Smith if you'd like more information.

Our first show this year at the **Faulkner** is upon us, with the **ingathering June 3**. Not only do we have the main room but, also both side galleries, which means that our juror can accept an extra forty pieces – a higher chance, though not a guarantee, that all the work you submit will be accepted. And since there is no guarantee, please plan your day accordingly, so that you or someone you designate can pick up any pieces not accepted that same afternoon. We wouldn't want you to be ineligible for our August show at the Faulkner

At the beginning of this fiscal year, most months a board member has been featured on this page, in the hope that the membership would have a better understanding of who is doing what. I drew the short straw this month, so here goes...
