Vice President's Message



Hi everyone, Nancy Hull here standing in for Cathie Smith,

The planning is well under way for our members only show at the Channing Peake which hangs for 9 months beginning in May. The schedule is still tentative, but we anticipate online entry starting March 28 and ending April 24, online jurying beginning April 25, and delivery of art around **May 16.** I know many of you thought you'd never see the day that the SBAA had online entry to a show, while others of you may be a bit shy about the process. The online entry is the easiest way for us to both accommodate the need for SBAA's juror to do the preliminary selection and prize assignments and also to subsequently allow the county's juror(s) access to the images for final approval. We are planning to allow four entries per artist, with the fee for the first being \$20, then \$10 each for entries 2 through 4. ShowSubmit.com, which some of you have used, will be hosting the online entry process. If you would like to enter this show, but you're uncertain about the process (e.g., resizing images) we're planning to have 2 or 3 members available for you to call for assistance, should you need help with the online instructions. Please keep your eyes open for updates about this show, and please contact me if you'd be willing to offer online show guidance to your fellow members.

One of the results of pandemic restrictions was that the downtown library was closed to the public for many months; consequently, artists who had assignments for the Faulkner Small Galleries during those months were reassigned months later in the year and through 2022. Because of this reshuffling, there has been no need, until now, to host selection of more artists for those galleries. The next open jurying for the Faulkner Small Galleries is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, June 4. This is a jurying that the SBAA provides as a community service, and it's open to all local artists. It will follow the same format as jurying

new members – 3 jurors, submission of 3 works of art in the morning, and retrieval and results in the afternoon. Once the artists have been selected, the gallery assignments- month & east/west gallery – will be made randomly. Please spread the word about this exciting chance for any 2 dimensional artist to have a solo show.

Do you have artist friends who would like to join SBAA? Please let them know that the next opportunity to be juried in is scheduled for **Saturday April 2**, with a follow-up orientation meeting on April 9. There are updated *How to Join* flyers at Gallery 113, and more information is available on the SBAA website on How to Join under the Information tab.

Lastly, don't forget that on **Saturday**, **February 19** the show at 1919 State will change. Here's your chance to be in a show with modest entry fees (\$5 per piece) and no gallery commission, in a venue with lots of foot traffic. I hope to see you there.
